CCIR honours contributions at 50th Anniversary celebrations

As part of its 50th Anniversary celebrations, the International Radio Consultative Committee honoured 46 living and 10 deceased persons who have made notable contributions to its work over the past 50 years.

This was done at a special ceremony which took place on the evening of 7 June 1978 at the Kyoto International Conference Centre, on the opening of the CCIR XIVth Plenary Assembly.

The ceremony was opened by Mr. R. C. Kirby, Director of the CCIR, with a short speech of welcome which was followed by addresses from Mr. H. Hirose, Deputy Minister of the Japanese Ministry of Posts and Telecommunications and Mr. M. Mili, Secretary-General of ITU. Dr. K. Miya, Managing Director of the Kokusai Denshin Denwa Co., Ltd. (KDD) delivered a commemorative lecture on the 50th Anniversary of the CCIR

Prof. Y. Angel (France)

Chairman of the Joint Study Group on television and sound transmission (CMTT) since its establishment in 1957.

Mr. A. L. Badalov (USSR)

Contributions over twenty years to the organization and working methods of CCIR; Vice-Chairman of the XIth (Oslo, 1966), XIIth (New Delhi, 1970) and XIIIth (Geneva, 1974) Plenary Assemblies.

Dr. D. K. Bailey (United States)

Technical contributions to, and leadership of, radio wave propagation studies from 1948 onward; Vice-Chairman and Chairman, CCIR Study Group on ionopheric propagation (1956-1957 and 1957-1978 respectively).

Dr. A. Bigi (Italy)

Chairman, CCIR/CCITT World Plan Committee (1966-1976); Chairman, CCIR IWP PLEN/I for reorganization of the CCIR (1966-1970).

on the subject of "The CCIR, radio science and radiocommunications" which was highly appreciated. Mr. Kirby then gave a brief account of the basis on which the awards recipients were selected. The persons honoured were chosen by inviting the telecommunications administrations of the 154 Member countries of the ITU to propose the names of persons who, in their view, had made the most distinguished contributions to the work of the CCIR, either by highly significant technical work contributed to CCIR

Study Groups, or by distinguished leadership of a CCIR activity over a period of several years.

The awards ceremony followed, with the Chairman of the Plenary Assembly, Mr. M. Hirano, making the presentations with Mr. Mili, and with Mr. Kirby reading the citations. Dr. D. K. Bailey, the senior Study Group Chairman present, spoke in response on behalf of the recipients. Following the ceremony a reception was offered by the Japanese Minister of Posts and Telecommunications.

Technical contributions over twenty years to CCIR studies of radio-relay and satellite communications; especially since 1970 contributions to studies of satellite television broadcasting.

Prof. Dr.-Ing. W. Bruch (F. R. of Germany) Technical contributions and leadership over twenty years in CCIR studies on sound and television broadcasting, especially standards for colour television broadcasting and recording.

Prof. F. Cappuccini (Italy)

Technical contributions and leadership over twenty years in CCIR studies in television broadcasting; Chairman since 1966 of Working Groups of CCIR Study Groups on television broadcasting.

Mr. P. David (France)

Chairman of Study Group II (Receivers) from 1948 to 1966.

Mr. B. Decaux (France)

Technical contributions to, and leadership of, integration of radio-relay systems into the international telecommunication network; Chairman, CCIR Study Group on radio-relay systems (1961-1974).

Technical contributions and sustained leadership of studies in radiotelegraphy and radiotelephony since the beginning of CCIR; Chairman, CCIR Study Group on complete systems (1948-1970).

Mr. R. C. Eldridge (Canada)

Contributions to CCIR studies in maritime and land mobile communications since 1960.

Mr. G. H. M. Gleadle (United Kingdom)

Chairman, CCIR Study Group on mobile services (1959-1974) during a period of considerable technical change and advance.

Prof. Dr. J. Groszkowski (P. R. of Poland)

Technical contributions and leadership in the studies of CCIR from its inception through a period of more than twenty years.

Dr. J. P. Hagen (United States)

Technical contributions to CCIR studies of radioastronomy; Vice-Chairman, CCIR Study Group on space research and radioastronomy (1970-1978).

Contributions to the international exchange of sound and television broadcasting; Vice-Chairman, CCIR Study Group on television broadcasting (1953-1970).
